

## **I-579 Overnight Improvements Continue this Week in Pittsburgh**

**Pittsburgh, PA** – PennDOT District 11 is announcing overnight improvement work on I-579 and associated ramps for the I-579 “Cap” Urban Connector project in the City of Pittsburgh, Allegheny County, will occur Tuesday through Friday nights, September 3-6 weather permitting.

Crews from the Joseph B. Fay Company will conduct overhang and parapet removal work, hang overhead jacks, demolition work, and line painting operations from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. requiring the following restrictions:

- Tuesday night, September 3 – The northbound I-579 left lane will be restricted and the northbound I-579 ramp to 7th Avenue will close to traffic. Motorists will be detoured.
- Wednesday night, September 4 – The northbound I-579 right lane will be restricted.
- Thursday night, September 5 – The northbound and southbound right shoulders will be restricted.
- Friday night, September 6 – The long-term closure of the northbound I-579 ramp to 7th Avenue begins at 8 p.m.

Posted Detour

Northbound I-579 to 7th Avenue

- From northbound I-579, take the PPG Arena/Centre Avenue off-ramp
- Turn right onto Washington Place
- Turn right onto Fifth Avenue
- Turn right onto 6th Avenue
- Turn right onto Grant Street
- Follow Grant Street back to 7th Avenue
- End detour

The work is part of the \$29.34 million project which will consist of the construction of a structure spanning I-579 to link downtown Pittsburgh and the Hill District. In part, the Cap project will create a new three-acre greenspace which will include pedestrian pathways, bicycle routes, rain gardens for stormwater management, and design elements from neighborhood artists. Additional construction activities include retrofitting existing retaining walls and bridges to accommodate the new structure, roadway reconstruction, drainage improvements, traffic signals, highway lighting, ITS, and landscaping.
